The **Men's 'B'** lost the opening set with Michael Pinnington losing 4-3; Captain Alan Collins (25.11) came back from 3-1 down to secure a 4-3 win; Matthew Garrett (24.87) returned to the team winning 4-2, before the unlucky Lennie Holmes lost out 4-3 to Liam Fox, Northamptonshire's man of the match.
